
SCHEDULE OF AWARENESS CAMPS

PATIENT-AID PROGRAM

India has made significant advances in the accessibility of effective and advanced cancer treatment. The Foundation is able to entrust the patients we fund into the care of capable doctors to avail of the correct cancer treatment. We have seen tremendous success in the health of the patients who have approached the Foundation. The core goal of the Foundation is to alleviate the economic burden of bearing the cost of the disease by providing financial aid for quality treatment. The fund is utilized only for general ward patients on a case-by-case basis. Only those patients who show critical economic need and who cannot afford treatment, are helped in this program.

HCG Foundation has helped over 5000 patients since its inception via:

- Concessions in the cost of treatment
- Covering the entire cost of treatment
- Providing medications for free (Drug Support)
- Wellness Support
- Psychological Support
- Provide employment opportunities (affected families).
- Education support



During the 2022-23 year, we helped 101 cancer patients to pay for their treatment.

DIRECT AID- FUNDRAISING AND DONATIONS


- By providing free or subsidized cancer care to patients who cannot afford treatment.

- Donation appeals are sent to agencies and individuals requesting support for our cause.




Number of patients assisted (distributed by age) AYA- adolescents and young adults

BUS AWARENESS CAMPS



Mobile Cancer Awareness Bus deployed in Gulbarga

With the advent of mobile health clinics, rural people now have access to vetted awareness material and cancer prevention and screening. We have conducted over 300 camps and reached over 30,000 participants through our mobile clinic.

The HCG Foundation engages in cancer awareness events regularly. The volunteers and staff of HCG Foundation extend their realm of work and reach out to different populations with the message of Cancer prevention. Participation in various activities to disseminate information on cancer risk factors, importance of cancer screening and early detection of disease is a regular feature.

Aiming at overcoming the hurdle of transportation that comes in the way of medical check-ups, HCG Foundation, in association with Infosys Foundation, launched a mobile cancer clinic in Karnataka in 2014.

doctor, Staffed with nurse paramedical staff (around five in all), the clinic is equipped with mammography, xray system, ultrasound system, pathology and lab. The mobile cancer clinic is deployed in Gulbarga to cater to districts in north Karnataka. The mobile clinic creates accessibility to advanced cancer screening and early diagnosis. It is a fully sufficient bus with advanced technology which helps in creating awareness by disseminating information about cancer through a television fitted inside the mobile clinic with provision to beam images onto a screen outside.

Using our mobile bus clinic, the furthest mile will be reached and educated on the intricacies of cancer. The goal of the mobile bus clinic is to leverage pre-existing infrastructure in the local communities to continue to educate and diagnosis and detect at the early stage in rural communities.




